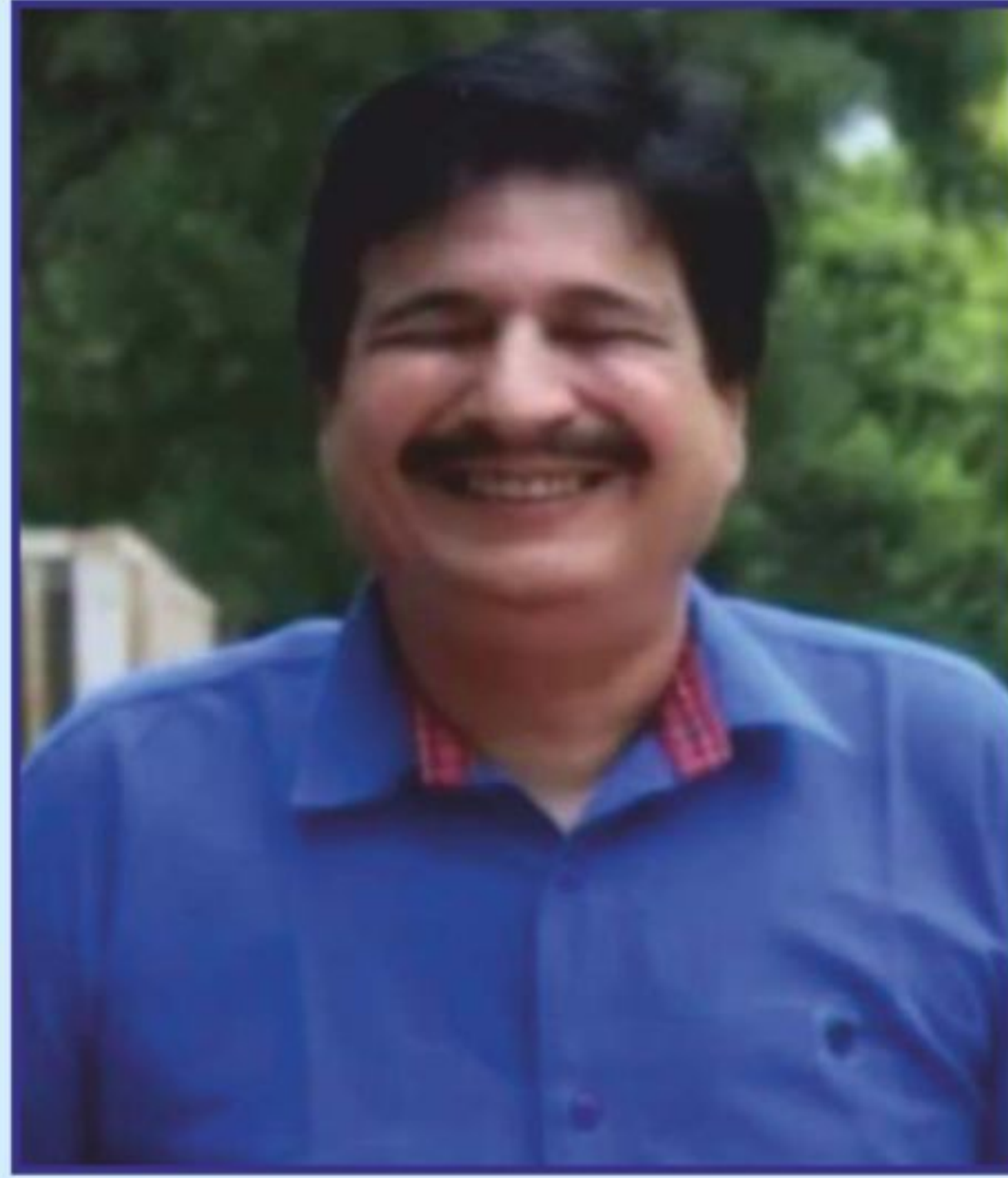

College Profile

Government College, Sector 14, Gurugram, holds a prestigious place in the educational landscape of Haryana with its foundation laid by the First Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, in 1959. The college was honored by the presence of the First President of India, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, during its first convocation. Over the years, it has also been graced by eminent leaders such as Smt. Indira Gandhi, the first woman Prime Minister of India, and Giani Zail Singh, the fifth President of India. The college is spread over a serene and lush green campus of 32 acres, adorned with well-maintained lawns and state-of-the-art infrastructure. It boasts five girls' hostels named after Indian rivers—Ganga, Narmada, Kaveri, and Saryu—providing safe and comfortable accommodation.

The college offers a vibrant atmosphere for holistic development through a wide array of academic, cultural, and sports activities. Students actively participate in various sports such as Chess, Archery, Basketball, Football, Judo, Cricket, Badminton, and Athletics, bringing laurels to the institution. With over 6924 students currently enrolled, the college has consistently maintained a reputation as one of the leading educational institutions in the region. Thousands of alumni have made significant contributions both in India and abroad, having been nurtured in the values and traditions upheld by the college. Constantly evolving with time, the college has introduced job-oriented and vocational courses alongside conventional programs to keep pace with modern educational demands.

College Staff

The college functions under the dynamic leadership of Principal Dr. Jitender Malik. A dedicated team of 10 Professors, 89 Assistant/Associate Professors, and 87 Extension Lecturers work tirelessly to impart quality education. The administrative and support staff includes 3 clerks, one lab assistant, one assistant, 3 library attendants, 2 junior lab attendants, one restorer, three sweepers, two peons, and one chowkidar.

College Bursar

All financial matters are efficiently handled under the able direction of Dr. Kuldip Singh Kait from the Department of Geography, ensuring transparency and proper fund management in all transactions.

College Library

The college takes immense pride in its spacious, well-equipped, and aesthetically maintained library. It houses more than 62,019 books catering to the diverse academic needs of students and faculty. The library subscribes to 16 newspapers and magazines in both English and Hindi. With a seating capacity of 140, it provides separate reading sections for students and faculty. A designated periodical and archive section preserves the rich history of the institution. The library remains open from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM on all working days.

To enhance accessibility, four OPAC machines have been installed, enabling students to locate books and resources easily. OPAC also provides access to remote e-resources such as N-LIST and NDLI. The library is equipped with seven computers and three printers for student use. Help desks are available to assist students in locating material, and a suggestion box ensures regular feedback for service improvement, implemented with the Principal's approval.

College Magazine

The annual college magazine '*Ramneek*' offers a platform to showcase the literary and creative talent of both students and faculty. Divided into three sections—English, Hindi, and Sanskrit—each section has one teacher and one student editor. Dr. Sonia from the Department of Hindi is the Editor-in-Chief, while Smt. Yogita Bajaj from the Department of English is the Editor for the English section. The magazine features articles, poems, and write-ups on current issues, fostering creativity and encouraging literary pursuits among students.

College Website

The college maintains a well-structured and regularly updated website www.gcgggn.ac.in, which offers comprehensive information regarding staff, departments, courses, syllabi, admissions, scholarships, events, and more. It serves as a digital gateway for prospective students and stakeholders to access the institution's resources and latest announcements.

NCC Report

The NCC unit of the college had an action-packed and inspiring session in 2024–25. The year commenced with remarkable success as four cadets participated in the Thal Sainik Camp, with three progressing to Pre-TSC-I and winning awards. Cadets actively engaged in the ATC-151 camp in Rohtak, excelling in events like drill, singing, dancing, and poster-making.

Their Guard of Honour performance garnered special attention. On Independence Day, 15th August 2024, cadets took part in the parade at Tau Devi Lal Stadium, led by UO Ruchika Yadav.

Two cadets attended the Basic Leadership Camp at NCC Academy, Malout from 3rd to 14th September and won multiple medals. A cleanliness drive was conducted on 21st September, where cadets showcased creativity by crafting items from waste. Cadet Sgt Tamanna participated in the Republic Day Camp after qualifying through several rounds, including IGC, Pre-RDC I, II, and III. UO Ruchika Yadav also distinguished herself by getting selected for the ALC and winning first place in the Inter-Directorate Quiz Competition with her team.

Another highlight was Cadet Naenaa Soni's participation in SNIC 2024 at Wokha, Nagaland, from 11th to 22nd December. The cadets again marched at Tau Devi Lal Stadium on 26th January 2025, Republic Day. The NCC 'B' Certificate exam was conducted on 1st and 2nd February, followed by the 'C' Certificate exam on 15th and 16th February 2025. The session concluded with a heartfelt farewell titled '*One Last Salute 25*' to bid adieu to the 2022–25 batch.

NSS Activity Report

The NSS cell successfully celebrated International Yoga Day on 21st June 2024, in collaboration with NCC and the Department of Sports. The event took place at 6:00 AM on the lawn in front of the Principal's office, with enthusiastic participation from students, college staff, and hostel members. The session was guided by Ms. Riddhi and Ms. Sunita Dureja from the Art of Living Foundation, emphasizing yoga as a step toward a healthy lifestyle and spreading the message "Yoga for Society."

On 13th July 2024, a Tree Plantation Drive was organized by the Eco Club and NSS in association with Bharat Vikas Parishad. Chief guests Dr. R.K. Garg (COE, Gurugram University), Mr. Arvind (SHO, Gurugram), and Dr. R.K. Aggarwal, along with their team members, participated by planting saplings in the lawns of the science block and chemistry department. Approximately 50 saplings of Jamun, Imli, Sehjan, Bakaan, and other species were planted. The dignitaries spoke on the importance of trees in our lives and the urgent need for environmental conservation.

The "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign was celebrated on 12th August 2024 with great patriotic zeal. As part of the nationwide initiative by the Government of India, students and staff

participated in activities such as Tiranga-making, Tiranga pledge, Tiranga selfie, and a Tiranga Yatra that began from the college campus and extended into the surrounding neighborhood. A Tiranga concert was also organized to further instill national pride among the youth.

On the same day, 12th August 2024, a Drug De-addiction Rally was conducted to promote freedom from drugs. Students took an oath to say “No” to drugs and “Yes” to a healthy lifestyle. A basketball match was also organized to promote physical activity as a positive alternative. The rally emphasized awareness under the slogan “Say No to Drugs, Say Yes to Life.”

Continuing with the “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” campaign, NSS volunteers planted trees both on campus and in their neighborhoods. Approximately 800 saplings of Imli, Gulmohar, Kachnar, and Papdi were planted in collaboration with various departments. Volunteers adopted plants and pledged to care for them, contributing meaningfully to the greening of their surroundings.

On 18th September 2024, a Health Awareness Camp focusing on women’s wellness and non-communicable diseases (NCDs) was held as part of Poshan Maah 2024. Dr. Bhudev opened the event with a yoga session, followed by an insightful talk by Dr. Ajay on stress, anxiety, and suicide prevention. Dr. Savita gave a session on breast cancer and NCDs, and Dr. Sonika discussed menstrual hygiene. A hemoglobin testing session was conducted by nurse Somvati. A live CPR therapy demonstration was particularly appreciated by students for its practical relevance and life-saving importance.

An Orientation Programme for new NSS volunteers was organized on 21st September 2024. Volunteers were introduced to the vision and objectives of NSS and informed about the NSS logo, clap, and song. They were briefed on the types of activities and camps conducted by the college and the requirements for earning merit certificates. Senior volunteers who had attended national-level camps shared their enriching experiences, motivating newcomers to actively participate.

On 28th September 2024, a One-Day Camp was held on the theme “Swachhta hi Seva” under both the Swachhta and Poshan Maah campaigns. Activities included a poster-making competition, classroom cleanliness drive, and awareness sessions on reducing single-use plastics and promoting eco-friendly alternatives. Volunteers visited classrooms, administered the Swachhta pledge, and aimed to engage over 1000 students in promoting cleanliness. Under the Poshan Maah campaign, Dr. Sikandra from the Home Science Department

delivered an expert lecture on nutrition and health. Volunteers also performed a nukkad natak titled “*Aaj Se Thoda Kam*” in the college ground, spreading awareness about healthy lifestyles.

Finally, on 25th October 2024, an Outreach Programme on MY Bharat was conducted. This event aimed to introduce students to the government’s *Mera Yuva Bharat (MY Bharat)* platform, designed to enhance youth engagement through experiential learning, leadership development, and digital mentorship. NSS volunteers were informed about the platform’s features and how it could help them contribute more effectively to society and national development.

On 31st October 2024, NSS Volunteers participated in the *Run for Unity Marathon* to commemorate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. The event began at 6:30 AM at Leisure Valley Park, Gurugram, with approximately 60 volunteers enthusiastically joining the run. This initiative aimed at promoting unity and harmony among the participants, resonating with Sardar Patel’s vision of a united India.

On 20th November 2024, the NSS Volunteers organized a *Nukkad Natak* on the theme “Drug Abuse and Drug Awareness.” The event aimed to raise awareness about the devastating consequences of drug addiction, especially among youth. The volunteers depicted real-life stories of drug abuse victims, highlighting the painful impact on both the addicts and their families. The street play served as a compelling call to action for a drug-free India and warned against the misleading glamour associated with drugs.

To mark the 75th Constitution Day on 25th November 2024, around 70 NSS Volunteers participated in a *Padyatra* led by the Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour & Employment, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya. The route began and ended at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium, covering iconic locations like Kartavyapath and India Gate. A grand exhibition showcasing the journey of the Indian Constitution and vibrant cultural performances enriched the experience. Participants collectively read the Preamble at India Gate, reinforcing the core constitutional values of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity.

On 23rd January 2025, the NSS Cell took part in *Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Jayanti* celebrations at Subhash Chandra Bose Park, Sector-14, Gurugram. The event, organized by the Municipal Corporation Gurugram, was graced by dignitaries including Dr. Balpreet Singh and Shri Jaiveer Yadav. NSS volunteers spread the message of cleanliness and the harmful effects of plastic through a street play, contributing meaningfully to the occasion.

The 76th Republic Day was celebrated on 26th January 2025 with immense patriotic spirit. Students, NSS and NCC volunteers, and faculty gathered to honor the nation and its freedom fighters. The National Flag was hoisted by Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik, followed by the singing of the National Anthem, creating a moment of deep national pride.

On 11th February 2025, *National Deworming Day* was observed with Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik inaugurating the program by distributing Albendazole tablets among students. About 600 pills were provided free of cost, and NSS volunteers played a vital role in organizing and distributing the medication.

From 15th to 21st February 2025, the NSS Cell organized a *Seven-Day Special Camp* under the theme "Youth for My Bharat and Youth for Digital Literacy." The camp was inaugurated by Retd. Prof. Dr. Ashok Yadav and Dr. Rajesh Yadav in the presence of Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik. Volunteers were divided into various committees, and a wide range of sessions were conducted on topics like the POSH Act, women empowerment, entrepreneurship, digital literacy, and organ donation. Outreach activities in Chandan Nagar Basti included rallies, donation drives, and Nukkad Nataks on Swachhta and drug abuse. Special workshops on menstrual health and urban governance were also organized. Cultural and sports activities enriched the evenings, and the camp concluded with a valedictory ceremony led by Prof. Anupam Dalal. The camp significantly empowered youth while instilling leadership and community values.

On 7th March 2025, a *One-Day Camp* was held in collaboration with United for Air, Carrier, MCG, and United Way of Delhi under the theme "Plogging for a Fitter, Cleaner India." This unique event combined jogging with litter collection and aimed to promote fitness and environmental consciousness. Students, staff, and residents of Chandan Nagar Basti participated actively. Gloves and biodegradable bags were provided, and refreshments served post-event. A special session on *Road Safety* was also conducted by Hero Group, which included a Nukkad Natak and a rally emphasizing traffic rule awareness.

A second *One-Day Camp* was conducted on 19th March 2025, beginning with a follow-up session of *Project Pavitra* in Yamuna Hostel by Ms. Riddhi from the Art of Living Foundation. It was followed by a *Health Awareness Talk* organized by People to People Health Foundation (PPHF), where Ms. Rekha spoke about obesity and student dietary habits for maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

On 12th April 2025, NSS volunteers took part in *CYCLOTHON 2.0 – "Ek Cycle Yatra Nasha Mukti Ke Naam"*, a cycling rally aimed at promoting a drug-free lifestyle. The rally began at Ghamroj Toll Plaza, where participants pledged to fight substance abuse, and concluded at Elan Miracle Chowk, covering 16 kilometers. The event served as both a physical activity and a campaign for a healthier, drug-free India.

On the same day, 12th April 2025, the NSS Units commemorated *Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Jayanti* with a series of events. These included a quiz competition on Ambedkar's life and philosophy, a pledge ceremony reinforcing constitutional values, and a speech activity that allowed students to reflect on his contributions to Indian society. The volunteers also paid tribute to Babasaheb Dr. Ambedkar, instilling a sense of pride and responsibility among the students.

Women Cell

The Women Cell of Government College for Girls, Sector-14, Gurugram is dedicated to promoting gender equality, safeguarding the rights and dignity of girls, and fostering a safe and supportive campus environment. To this end, the cell has conducted various awareness sessions and extension lectures by subject experts on important women-centric issues such as PCOD, gender discrimination, sexual harassment, gender sensitization, women's rights, the POSH Act, women's empowerment, police procedures, and legal redressal mechanisms. These sessions help equip students with awareness and confidence to face real-life challenges. The Women's Cell has also organized a one-week yoga session focusing on girls' mental health, self-defence training programs to promote leadership and confidence, and skill enhancement training sessions. Moreover, sessions on cyber security and physical and mental health awareness were held. Events like International Women's Day, Breast Cancer Awareness campaigns, menstrual hygiene awareness drives, and "Worth Day" celebrations (dedicated to women and Mother Earth) were organized. Through these initiatives, the Women's Cell actively challenges oppressive patriarchal norms and promotes gender sensitivity and empowerment.

Eco-Club Activities

The Eco-Club began its activities in July 2024 by encouraging students to participate in the National Students Paryavaran Competition (NSPC) held from 1st July to 21st August. A large number of students took part and shared their participation certificates with mentors. On 13th July, a tree plantation drive was organized in collaboration with the NSS and Bharat Vikas

Parishad, Gurugram. On 9th August, the Sanjeevani Biological Society and Eco Club, in association with United for Air NGO, hosted an awareness lecture and composting workshop on “Building a Sustainable Future” chaired by Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik. An extension lecture was organized on 11th September on the theme “Mountain Solutions for a Sustainable Future: Innovation, Adaptation, Youth, and Beyond,” delivered by mountaineer Mr. Narender Singh.

On 13th September, the Eco Club and Sanjeevani Biological Society celebrated World Ozone Day under the theme “Montreal Protocol: Advancing Climate Action.” The lecture was delivered by Mr. Saurabh Mendiratta, Technical Lead at United Way of Delhi, who emphasized the importance of protecting the ozone layer. On 7th March 2025, an enlightening extension lecture titled "Main aur Mera Paryavaran" (Me and My Environment) was jointly organized by the Eco Club and NSS. The session, led by Dr. Savita Nagpal, highlighted effective environmental management practices.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell organized a series of extension lectures for students across all streams to provide guidance and career direction. On 24th February 2025, Dr. Anshita Yadav from Gurugram University delivered a session on career opportunities for commerce graduates. On 27th February, Dr. Naveen Kumar from the Department of Management, Gurugram University, addressed students on placement opportunities. The same day, Yukti Bhardwaj, Ex-Director, AIM Infrabuild, delivered a session on “Career Counselling: A Guide to Unlock Your Path to Success.” On 9th April, an orientation program titled “Skill for Youth” was conducted by Ms. Honey Sodhi from Team Everest. Additionally, two impactful career counselling sessions were held on 15th April 2025 by Mr. Rajesh Talwar, a healthcare professional from Skill India, and Dr. Supreet Kaur, Principal and Chief Embryologist at RACE, Gurugram.

Hostel Annual Report

The hostel of the college hosted multiple celebrations and developmental activities throughout the year. A Diwali party was celebrated on 12th November 2024 with full enthusiasm, featuring competitions and performances attended by Chief Warden Mrs. Namita and other staff. A New Year’s Eve celebration was held on 31st December 2024, followed by Lohri festivities on 13th January 2025, attended by Principal Dr. Jitender Malik and the hostel team. Students enjoyed the celebration with music, popcorn, and peanuts.

From 17th to 22nd March 2025, a week-long yoga training session was conducted by Yoga Trainer Mrs. Suman under the aegis of the Women's Cell. On 24th April, a grand farewell party was organized for the final-year UG and PG students. The Miss Farewell competition was judged by Mrs. Monika, Lecturer in Computer Science, and the event was attended by hostel wardens and staff.

Another major initiative was *Mission Manikarnika*, a self-defence training session conducted in collaboration with Gurugram Police from 22nd to 26th April 2025. Special guests included mountaineer Anita Kundu and Shri Rakesh Mutareja, Executive Director IRRAH, and Founder Mrs. Amandeep Hora. The program was highly motivational for the students.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

On 18th February 2025, the Department of Economics conducted a Poster Making Competition on the theme "Union Budget 2025-2026" to raise awareness among students. Participants showcased their creativity in depicting welfare schemes. The event was well-judged and participants were appreciated.

On 18th March 2025, a budget discussion was held to analyze and understand the 2025–2026 Union Budget. Dr. Seema Yadav, initiated the session and highlighted new schemes and norms introduced in the budget. Students actively contributed to the discussion and asked relevant questions. Faculty members and all classes of the department participated, and the session concluded with key insights from the budget.

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

On 28th August 2024, an extension lecture on "Chemistry Lab Operations and Safety Measures" was conducted by Dr. Neeru Dabas from Amity University, Manesar. Over 50 students and all chemistry faculty participated. On 22nd October 2024, a one-day event comprising a chemistry quiz, poster-making, slogan writing, and declamation competitions was organized and judged by Dr. Sushila Srivastava and Ms. Smriti Sharma.

In November 2024, students Priya and Nikita won second place at the Science Mela held at ITI Gurgaon. December was dedicated to theory exams for second- and third-year students, followed by semester exams in January 2025. On 8th February 2025, the department organized an inter-district science exhibition in the hostel reading room, where the model titled "Innovative Models for Biofuel and Environmental Management" by Priya and Kriti won 1st place in the Chemistry category. The event was judged by retired professors Dr. Sushma Sharma and Rita Sharma.

On 21st–22nd February 2025, the same model was showcased at the State Level Science Exhibition at Pt. C. L. S. Govt. College, Karnal, under the mentorship of Ms. Dypsy Khapra. Finally, on 28th February 2025, National Science Day was celebrated with an extension lecture by Dr. Chandra Mohan on the topic “Scope of NEP 2020: A Review,” attended by over 50 students and faculty members.

DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY - SANJEEVANI BIOLOGICAL SOCIETY

The Sanjeevani Biological Society of the Department of Botany and Zoology organized a range of academic and co-curricular activities during the session 2024–25. On 9th August 2024, in collaboration with the United for Air NGO and Eco Club, the society conducted a thought-provoking guest lecture and awareness-cum-composting workshop on the theme "*Building a Sustainable Future.*" The event aimed to sensitize students about environmental challenges and sustainable solutions.

On 31st August 2024, all science departments jointly hosted a *District Level Science Quiz Competition 2024*, followed by a *District Level Science Essay Writing Competition* held on 4th September 2024, sponsored by the Haryana State Council for Science, Innovation & Technology (HSCIST). In celebration of World Ozone Day on 13th September 2024, the Eco Club and Sanjeevani Biological Society organized an awareness program under the global theme "*Montreal Protocol: Advancing Climate Action.*"

Continuing its commitment to environmental awareness, the society celebrated *National Wildlife Week* with the theme “*Our National Heritage: Human-Wildlife Coexistence.*” As part of this celebration, an extension lecture was organized on 14th October 2024 for students of the science stream. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Pawan Kumar and focused on pressing issues in wildlife conservation.

The Science Departments collectively organized an *Inter-District Level Science Exhibition* under the aegis of the Department of Higher Education, Haryana, on 8th February 2025. This was followed by a *Zonal Level Science Quiz Contest* on 19th February 2025. Students selected in the zonal exhibition went on to participate in the *Two-Day State Level Science Exhibition* held at Pandit Chiranjilal Sharma Government College, Karnal, on 22nd and 23rd February 2025. In this prestigious event, the Physics model secured the 1st position, while Zoology and Psychology models earned 2nd positions respectively, reflecting the dedication and creativity of the students and faculty involved.

On 4th April 2025, the Sanjeevani Biological Society organized an *educational trip to DPG College* for B.Sc. students from Medical, Zoology Honours, and Botany Honours streams. The trip provided a valuable hands-on learning experience and exposure to real-world applications in medical zoology and botany. Interactive sessions and live demonstrations deepened the students' understanding of complex scientific concepts, while expert-led lectures and workshops offered insightful guidance. The trip fostered teamwork, curiosity, and enthusiasm among students. Special thanks were extended to the DPG College management for their support, the Sanjeevani Biological Society for organizing the trip, and the faculty members for their active involvement and mentorship.

DEPARTMENT OF HOME SCIENCE

The Department of Home Science organized and participated in several academic and co-curricular activities during the academic year 2024–2025. A three-day workshop on fabric designing was conducted by Pidilite from 9th to 11th September 2024, aimed at enhancing the creative and technical skills of students. In collaboration with NSS and Ayush, the department also celebrated *Poshan Maah* from 7th to 29th September 2024. The celebration included a series of awareness activities such as a lecture on health education, a free health check-up camp with medicine distribution, poster and slogan making, a student rally, and food distribution to underprivileged children. On 15th October 2024, B.Sc. third-year students were taken to Saras Mela to explore various Indian textiles and handlooms, offering them valuable practical exposure. A career counselling session was organised by the T3S Foundation on 5th March 2025, guiding Home Science students regarding their career prospects. Additionally, a fabric painting workshop was held by Pidilite on 2nd April 2025 to provide hands-on training in creative fabric design.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

The Physics Department conducted various academic activities aimed at enriching students' scientific knowledge and skills. A District Level Science Quiz was held on 31st August 2024, providing a platform for students to test their scientific aptitude. An extension lecture on “Nanotechnology and Sustainability” was delivered by Dr. Dilraj Preet Kaur, Associate Professor at K. R. Mangalam University, Sohna, Gurugram, on 6th September 2024, offering valuable insights into advanced scientific developments. A poster-making competition was

held on 28th September 2024, followed by a departmental-level science exhibition on 7th November 2024, where students presented innovative scientific models and experiments. A District Level Physics Exhibition was organised on 8th February 2025, and a Zonal Level Science Quiz was successfully conducted on 19th February 2025, encouraging inter-college participation and fostering a spirit of healthy scientific competition.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The Department of Botany, under the aegis of Sanjeevani Biological Society and Eco Club in collaboration with the NGO United for Air, organized an enlightening awareness lecture and composting workshop titled “*Building a Sustainable Future*” on 9th August 2024. The event was held under the chairmanship of Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik. Guest speakers Mr. Mohan and Ms. Rajni shared insightful perspectives on sustainable living and effective waste management. The session focused on the principles of reducing, reusing, and recycling waste and emphasized individual responsibility in contributing to sustainability. Students and faculty members actively engaged in interactive sessions and hands-on composting activities, making the workshop both educational and impactful. Gratitude was expressed towards the United for Air NGO for their support, and appreciation was extended to the society and club members for the successful execution of the event.

In addition, the department played a key role in organizing the *District Level Science Quiz Competition* on 31st August 2024, sponsored by the Haryana State Council for Science, Innovation, and Technology. The event was graced by Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik and Smt. Anita Rathi. A total of 13 teams from across the district participated in the written screening round, from which the top eight qualified for the oral quiz. The oral round consisted of four segments—main questions, visual, activity-based, and rapid-fire—conducted by quiz masters Dr. Prachi Gupta and Dr. Sangeeta from the Biotech Department. The top five teams selected for the zonal level included Dronacharya Government College Gurugram, GCG Sector 14 Gurugram, Government College Sector 9 Gurugram, and Suraj Degree College Gurugram. Winners were felicitated with certificates by the Principal, Dr. Sushila Srivastava (Convenor), and Dr. Anita Rathi. The event also witnessed enthusiastic audience participation and was ably anchored by Dr. Rakhi Kaushik and Dr. Mansi Arora. The program concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Sushila Srivastava, leaving a lasting impact on all participants.

DISTRICT LEVEL SCIENCE ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

A District Level Science Essay Writing Competition, sponsored by the Haryana State Council for Science, Innovation & Technology (HSCIST), was successfully organized on 4th September 2024. The event was coordinated by the faculties of all Science Departments under the guidance of Principal, Dr. Jitendra Malik. A total of twenty-seven participants from seven colleges of Gurugram, namely Dronacharya Government College, Government College Sector-9, Government College Sector-52, Government College Jatauli Haily Mandi, Government College Sidhrawali, DPG College, and Government College for Girls, Sector-14 Gurugram, participated in the competition. The topics for essay writing, selected by HSCIST, included: *Why is Sustainable Agriculture Important*, *Science and Technology in Ancient India*, *Cybercrime and its Prevention*, *Renewable Energy: Why is it Crucial for the Modern World*, and *Science to Scale Up Milk Production*. The competition was judged by Ms. Archana Soota, Principal of Government College Kharkhda (Rewari), along with former principals Ms. Rita Sharma and Mr. Pratap Singh. The collective efforts of all Science faculty members were instrumental in making this event a success.

CELEBRATION OF WORLD OZONE DAY

The Eco Club and Sanjeevani Biological Society celebrated *World Ozone Day* on 13th September 2024 under the theme “*Montreal Protocol: Advancing Climate Action*” as per the guidelines issued by the Directorate General of Higher Education, Haryana. The event was organized under the chairmanship of Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik and convened by Ms. Anita Rathee. An extension lecture was delivered by Mr. Saurabh Mendiratta, Technical Lead and Environmental Professional from United Way of Delhi, who raised awareness about the protective role of the ozone layer and emphasized sustainable practices to preserve it. He educated the students about India’s proactive role in implementing the *Montreal Protocol*, which focuses on phasing out ozone-depleting substances like CFCs, thus contributing to global climate protection and public health. Another guest speaker, Mr. Mohan Singh Rawat, Campaign Coordinator at United for Air Campaign (United Way of Delhi), also addressed the students, highlighting the organization’s mission to empower communities through data-driven environmental initiatives. The lecture inspired a sense of environmental responsibility among students. CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL WILDLIFE WEEK

The Sanjeevani Biological Society, in collaboration with the Department of Zoology, celebrated *National Wildlife Week* on 14th October 2024 under the theme “*Our National Heritage: Human-Wildlife Coexistence.*” An extension lecture was organized for Science stream students and delivered by Dr. Pawan Kumar, who raised awareness about the significance of wildlife and the need for peaceful human-wildlife coexistence. The event aimed to instill environmental consciousness and the importance of biodiversity conservation among students.

INTER DISTRICT LEVEL SCIENCE EXHIBITION

The Science Department hosted an *Inter District Level Science Exhibition* on 8th February 2025 under the chairmanship of Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik and the patronage of the Department of Higher Education, Haryana. The event’s chief guest was Professor Dr. Sarala Balachandran, Chairperson of the Chemistry Department, Gurugram University. The exhibition featured projects from seven departments—Chemistry, Computer Science, Zoology, Botany, Psychology, Physics, and Geography. A total of 58 teams from thirteen colleges across Gurugram, Jhajjar, and Bahadurgarh participated with innovative models and ideas addressing global challenges. ZONAL LEVEL SCIENCE QUIZ CONTEST (2024–25)

The Science Department organized the *Zonal Level Science Quiz Contest 2024–25* on 19th February 2025, under the chairmanship of Principal Dr. Jitendra Malik and the aegis of the Haryana State Council for Science, Innovation and Technology (Directorate of Science and Technology, Haryana). The event was graced by Chief Guest Dr. Rahul Taneja, Principal Scientist, along with Sh. Kamal Deep, Senior Accountant Officer, Department of Science and Technology, Panchkula. The quiz was conducted by Quiz Master Dr. Ravi Kant, Assistant Professor of Chemistry, M.N.S. Government College, Bhiwani. The event was supervised by Sh. Bijender Kumar, Inspector (Food and Supply), Government of Haryana. STATE LEVEL SCIENCE EXHIBITION

Students who were selected at the Zonal Level Science Exhibition participated in the *State Level Science Exhibition* held at Pandit Chiranji Lal Sharma Government College, Karnal. Representing the college, students from the Departments of Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, and Psychology presented their innovative models based on the given theme. The Physics Department secured first position, while the Zoology and Psychology Departments were awarded second position. The Principal, Dr. Jitendra Malik, congratulated all the students for

their commendable achievements and motivated them to continue their academic pursuits with dedication and vision.

EDUCATIONAL TRIP REPORT (BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES)

The Sanjeevani Biological Society organized an educational trip for B.Sc. (Medical Zoology and Botany) students to DPG College on 4th April 2025. The objective of the visit was to provide hands-on learning experiences and real-world exposure in the fields of medical zoology and botany. During the visit, students participated in interactive sessions and demonstrations that helped them better understand complex scientific concepts. Expert lectures and workshops conducted as part of the trip offered valuable academic insights. The excursion successfully promoted curiosity, teamwork, and enthusiasm among the students.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

The Department of Commerce began the academic session with an orientation programme on 22nd July 2024 for the new entrants. The students were introduced to the college infrastructure, teaching faculty, timetable, and the different academic and extracurricular cells functioning within the institution. To provide practical exposure, an educational trip was organized on 6th September 2024 to introduce students to the Jeevika Skill Development Programme. Around 100 students participated and benefitted from this experience.

An extension lecture on “*Speed Maths*” was held on 18th September 2024, conducted by Mr. Gaurav Ghosh from the TIME Institute. Approximately 90 students attended the session, which helped enhance their mathematical efficiency. Additionally, ten students from the Commerce Department participated in a nationwide online quiz competition organized by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), further expanding their knowledge of financial systems.

Throughout the session, several offline workshops and lectures were also held for final-year students on the theme of *Banking and Financial Services*. These were organized in collaboration with Jeevika Skill Development and conducted in Room No. 43, aiming to prepare students for professional readiness and skill enhancement in the financial sector.

DEPARTMENT OF SANSKRIT

In the academic session 2024–25, the Department of Sanskrit at Government College for Girls, Sector-14, Gurugram, actively organized a variety of cultural and academic events aimed at promoting the Sanskrit language and enhancing student engagement. Competitions such as Shloka recitation, Sanskrit quiz, Sanskrit conversation, Sanskrit solo song, letter

writing, and essay writing were conducted throughout the session. In these events, students of the college performed commendably, securing first, second, and third positions.

A Sanskrit Quiz Competition was held on 28th August 2024, followed by a Sanskrit Conversation Competition on 18th September 2024. On 15th October 2024, the department organized both a Sanskrit Solo Song and another round of the Sanskrit Quiz Competition. The Sanskrit Letter Writing Competition was conducted on 22nd February 2025, and the academic year concluded with a Sanskrit Essay Writing Competition on 21st March 2025. These activities collectively fostered linguistic proficiency and cultural appreciation among students.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY

The Department of Biotechnology conducted several significant academic and co-curricular activities during the session 2024–25. An Orientation Programme for first-year B.Sc. Biotechnology students was held on 22nd August 2024. This session acquainted students with the new academic environment and introduced them to the syllabus, internal assessment scheme, and career opportunities aligned with NEP-2020.

On 24th August 2024, the department, in collaboration with the NSS, organized a tree plantation drive titled "*Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam.*" Around 30 saplings of species like Imli, Gulmohar, Kachnar, and Papdi were planted by Biotechnology students along the path between the New Science Block and Hostel.

To enhance experiential learning, eight students participated in the AICTE IDEA Lab Tech Fest 2025 in New Delhi on 7th March 2025. The students observed live project demonstrations and attended technical panel discussions, gaining insights into current innovations in science and technology.

On 7th April 2025, coinciding with World Health Day, the department hosted a Career Counselling Session titled "*Avenues in Public Health.*" Esteemed speakers Prof. (Dr.) Preeti Negandhi, Prof. (Dr.) Akashdeep, and Ms. Tanuja Bhandari from the Indian Institute of Public Health, Delhi, addressed nearly 100 students from various science streams. The session provided clarity on career prospects in public health, health economics, and the role of public health professionals in India.

An Educational Cum Experiential Visit was organized on 25th April 2025 to Amity University, Gurugram. Approximately 30 students toured the Department of Biotechnology

and participated in hands-on lab sessions related to molecular biology. They also engaged with faculty members and explored ongoing research work at the university.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Department of Physical Education saw active student participation in multiple inter-college and national-level events during the academic year 2024–25. Students represented the college in Inter-College Tournaments for Taekwondo (Women), Boxing (Women), and Athletics (Women), showcasing remarkable dedication and sportsmanship.

Yogita, a B.A. 1st-year student, won a bronze medal in Archery at the North Zone Tournaments and secured a gold medal at BML Munjal University, Gurugram.
